Family Health services to expand thanks to new funding

MOBILE, Alabama — Family Health, the primary care division of the Mobile County Health Department, is pleased to announce that it has received \$527,000 from the Health Resources and Services Administration. The additional funding will be used to expand its mission to new service areas within Baldwin, Choctaw and Mobile counties.

Since 1979, Family Health has been driven by the three pillars of public health care — increased affordability, increased accessibility and high quality. These goals also serve as the foundation of Family Health’s mission to provide high quality and culturally diverse primary care, preventive health services, dental care and social services to those in need. Regardless of a client’s ability to pay, Family Health is committed to accomplishing this goal with every patient encounter.

As a Primary Care Medical Home and Joint Commission-accredited facility, Family Health proudly provides comprehensive primary care serves those who are insured, underinsured or uninsured; on Medicaid; medically underserved; homeless; low-income children; the elderly; and those at or below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level.

Family Health also serves special populations such as Migrant and Seasonal Farm Workers, Public Housing residents, refugees, maternity patients and those with HIV/AIDS. Through evidence-based practices, Family Health has created a healthcare system that includes 10 Federally Qualified Health Centers and a mobile medical unit that span from Mount Vernon to Tillman’s Corner to Baldwin County.

- Women's Health Center (248 Cox Street, Mobile, 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. weekdays expect Wednesday when it remains open to 6 p.m.)
- The Maj. Gen. William C. Gorgas Clinic (Downtown Mobile at 251 N. Bayou Street, 7:30 a.m. to 6 p.m.)
- The Urgent Care facility (located inside the Maj. Gen. William C. Gorgas Clinic, open from 7:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. on weekdays and 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays)
